

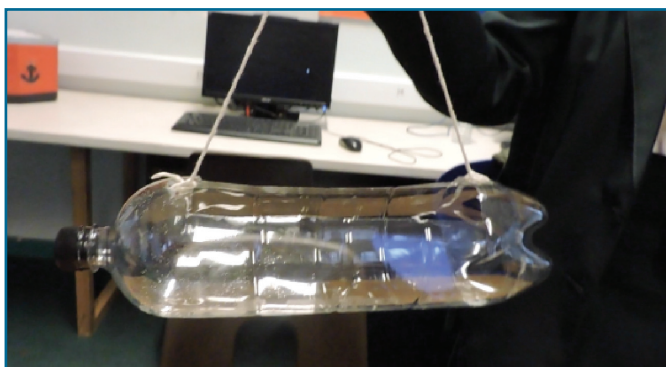
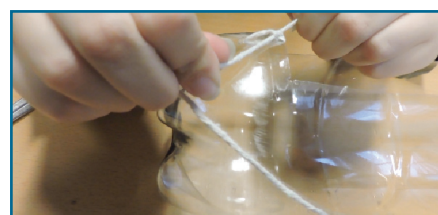
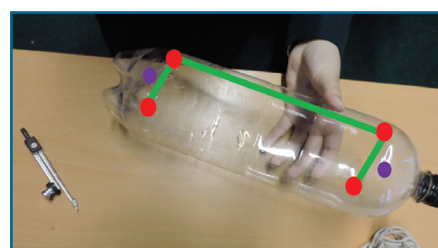
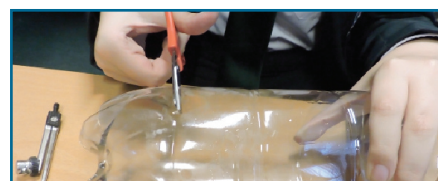
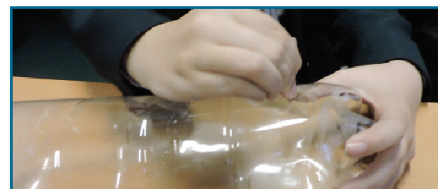
Hanging garden tutorial from Nunnery Wood High School

Equipment:

- Empty 2 litre drinks bottle [washed out with no label]
- Scissors
- Sharp compass [or other sharp object that can be used to make holes]
- String [or wool]

Method

1. Get your bottle and poke four holes in a rectangular shape with the compass [see the red dots on the picture]. Make sure they are all in line with each other and only in the top of the bottle so you have an opening. It cannot go below the halfway line.
2. Next take your scissors and cut between the holes that you've made. Make sure the lines are as straight as possible. You'll end up with a cut out rectangle part on top of the bottle [see the green lines on the picture].
3. Now get the compass again and poke two more holes in the middle of the short sides on the rectangle [see the purple dots on the picture]. Make sure these holes are big enough to poke the string through.
4. Get your string and pull it through one of the holes. Tie it off [with a double knot for security] then cut it off at about 40-50cm approximately [or wherever you want it, dependent on how far you want it to hang down].
5. Get the freshly cut end of the string and push it through the other hole. Tie it again with a double knot.
6. You're finished! Fill it with soil and seeds and hang it on a wall from a hook or wherever you fancy. Don't forget to water it!
