













The rules in Kenya on equal pay and equality and work state that men and women should be given equal pay for equal jobs.

- "Eliminating all forms of discrimination at the work place, including pay, guarantees both women and men equality of opportunity in employment, as well as equal pay for work of equal value."




This graph shows the annual earnings (in dollars) for people of different gender and race in the US:


OECD nations' pay gap by gender (2010)


WHAT THE GENDER PAY GAP LOOKS LIKE FOR WOMEN 4 YEARS AFTER GRADUATION

GREAT BRITAIN'S GENDER PAY GAP 1970-2008


% difference between Male and Female earnings
